

Museum / Church Renovation Update

The finishing touches are being made and next will begin the retouching of the pews. The original structure was built in 1910 as a church and school. In 1919 it was expanded with the addition of the sanctuary and bell towers. With the completion of the new St. Anthony's church structure in 1951, the old church building was moved to <u>Clarkwood</u> and was renamed "Our Lady of Mt. Carmel". The Violet Historical Society board members voted to re-purpose the old church to, once again, function as a secondary worship facility for use by the Parish to host special events, week day masses and small weddings.

The renovations have maintained the original intricate architectural and spiritual components to all extents possible. A new entrance landing, access ramp, steps and railings are nearing completion. The Rectory portion of the church is planned to remain with existing furnishings to preserve that portion of the church's historical significance.
