Second Sunday of Advent - The Second Advent candle is also purple and symbolizes peace. Also known as the "Bethlehem Candle," signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. Sometimes the second week's candle is used to symbolize faith. The Peace Candle symbolizes the peace that Jesus Christ brings to the world. It represents the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies of a Messiah who would be the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6). It reminds us that through



the birth of Jesus, humanity can find reconciliation with God and experience inner peace. During the lighting of the Peace Candle, appropriate Bible verses that emphasize peace and reconciliation may be read, such as Isaiah 9:6, Luke 2:14, or John 14:27.

"Gracious God, as we light the second candle of this Advent wreath, we seek your peace. In a world filled with turmoil, may the light of this candle remind us of the peace that only you can bring. Help us to be instruments of your peace in our homes, communities, and the world. Amen "

Museum / Church Renovation Update

Work continues and is nearing completion on the renovation of the original St. Anthony's Church. The original structure was built in 1910 as a church and school. In 1919 it was expanded with the addition of the sanctuary and bell towers. With the completion of the new St. Anthony's church structure in 1951, the old church building was moved to Clarkwood and was renamed "Our Lady of Mt. Carmel". With the construction of a new church structure in Clarkwood, the Old St. Anthony's church sat abandoned. Led by David Kircher and wife Barbara, the old church was moved back to Violet and renovated to become a museum commemorating Violet, Texas settlement and history. The museum opened in 1976, but had become underutilized over the recent past years. The Violet Historical Society board members voted to re-purpose the old church to, once again, function as a secondary worship facility for use by the Parish to host special events, week day masses and small weddings.

The renovations have maintained the original intricate architectural and spiritual components to all extents possible. A new entrance landing, access ramp, steps and railings are nearing completion. The Rectory portion of the church is planned to remain with existing furnishings to preserve that portion of the church's historical significance.

The Old St. Anthony's Church is recognized by the Texas Historical Commission and is included in the National Register of Historic Places.
