Lenten Season

The Lenten Season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2026.

5:00 p.m. Adoration

6:00 p.m. Mass and Distribution of Ashes

Mass - Friday during Lent 8:00 a.m.

Stations of Cross - Friday evening 6:00 p.m.

FAST & ABSTINENCE

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. **However, for those 59 and older and in reasonable health, this discipline does not apply, but can reap from the Spiritual benefits from abstaining from meat.** When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Message of Pope Leo XIV for Lent 2026 *"Listening and Fasting: Lent as a Time of Conversion"*

Our Lenten Journey can consist number of soul searching resources; Social Media, such as the Hallow App that can be downloaded on your cell phone or computer and many other items. However, Pope Leo XIV offers this:

Listening - consider the importance of making room for the word through *listening*. The willingness to listen is the first way we demonstrate our desire to enter into a relationship with God.

Fasting - this is a concrete way to prepare ourselves to receive the word of God. Abstaining from ~~food~~ is an ancient ascetic practice that is essential on the path of conversion. Our fasting, "hunger", can teach us to pray and act responsibly towards our neighbor.

Together - Lent emphasizes the communal aspect of listening to the word and fasting. The Bible itself underlines this dimension in multiple ways. Together we undertake a shared journey during Lent, in which listening to the word of God, as well as to the cry of the poor and of the earth, becomes part of our community life, and fasting a foundation for sincere repentance.

"Dear friends, let us ask for the grace of a Lent that leads us to greater attentiveness to God and to the least among us. Let us ask for the strength that comes from the type of fasting that also extends to our use of language, so that hurtful words may diminish and give way to a greater space for the voice of others. Let us strive to make our communities places where the cry of those who suffer finds welcome, and listening opens paths towards liberation, making us ready and eager to contribute to building a civilization of love.

I impart my heartfelt blessing upon all of you and your Lenten journey."
